


Information for new students

What to do on Day One



Don't take all your new books and stationery for Year 7 with you on the first day; otherwise you could be weighed down with a lot of equipment. Consider only taking pens, pencils and some exercise books/paper with you. You will be allocated a locker and receive your timetable on Day One and you will be able to bring the rest of your equipment over the remainder of the week.


- Remember to write your name on all your books and equipment as well as labelling your school uniform.
- If you have friends coming to the same school, or you already have friends at Red Cliffs SC, consider going to school with them on at least the first day to make sure you know where to go.
- If you bring your lunch with you, you won't have to worry about how to order or buy your lunch at the canteen. This is just another way of reducing all the new things you have to do and learn on day 1.
- If a family member is picking you up after school, make sure you know exactly where they will be parked at the end of the school day. (3:20pm finish) Cars are not permitted to enter the school grounds and/or bus stop to pick up students. Parking is available on Fitzroy Avenue.
- Introduce yourself to someone you don't know. They will probably appreciate it and then you will know someone new.



What to do when you arrive

- Order your lunch at the canteen before the first bell – Canteen opens at 8.00 a.m.
- When the first bell rings, make your way to the Activity Centre for a '**Whole School Assembly**'. You will have to take your bag and all belongings with you at this stage. You will be given information about the program for the rest of the day.
- A **Year Level Assembly** and a **Form Assembly** will follow, where your personal details will be checked. Listen carefully because it is important that your files contain accurate information. If any of your details have changed since you completed your enrolment form, then you should bring this information with you on Day One.
- During Form Assembly you will be told which Sporting House you have been allocated to. Remember this because this will be your House for the whole time you are at Red Cliffs Secondary College. If you have brothers or sisters at the school already, you probably know which House you will be in! A **House Assembly** is the next place to go to where the main purpose is to elect House Captains and their Deputies. Year 7 students do not vote but it is important to get to know your House leaders.
- After recess classes start as per the timetable that you will have received in Form Assembly.
- Don't worry about getting lost or confused. There are plenty of people happy to help you.

Frequently Asked Questions



Appointments

Parents are requested where possible to arrange appointments and commitments outside college hours. If necessary, procedures for Early Leavers must be followed. We appreciate that unexpected circumstances arise, however, where possible notice in advance would be appreciated before collecting the student from school.

Attendance and Absence Notes

Students are legally required to attend school until the age of 17. If an absence is known in advance please send a note or make a phone call to the school. If a student is absent please phone the school before 9 a.m. on the day. Phone or SMS contact is made to the parent if no message of your child's absence has been received. A message can be left on the school's answering machine at any time day or night or when the office is unattended.

Being Prepared for Class

Each lesson students are required to have their study planner, pencil case and appropriate books with them. Pencil cases need to be large enough to hold a ruler, calculator, HB pencils, coloured pencils, pens, eraser, pencil sharpener, compass, protractor, glue and scissors. Being well prepared for class means the lesson can flow smoothly. It is annoying for everyone when equipment needs to be shared and students' waste time waiting for others who have to use their ruler or scissors. Students should take what they need for both classes as we discourage students from going to their lockers in between lessons. For Physical Education and Sport classes the sports uniform is required.

Bus Travel

Students with older siblings will have the advantage of knowing which bus to catch and where. Students new to the school who need to travel by bus and are unsure of what to do should contact Miss Broster. For questions regarding the public bus service please contact Buslink Sunraysia.

Camps

Year 7's will have the opportunity to attend a five day trip to Adelaide. This camp is conducted during December. Students will receive more information about this camp during the year.

Canteen Helpers

Any parent who would like to help in the canteen, please contact the college on 5024 1522 and ask for the Canteen Manager.

Contact Details

It is very important that these are accurate in case of emergencies etc. Parents need to let us know as soon as possible if any details change.

Communication with Parents

- Twice a term the staff members complete a 'work advice' reminder for students who are not performing to expectations. This is sent home to parents.

Computers

Students will be provided with a password to use netbooks and computers in the school. Initially there is a \$10 account to cover the cost of printing. Students may top this up in \$5 amounts by paying at the canteen window any morning before school starts. The use of the Internet is covered in the College Service Fee. Students have access to cloud storage and it is strongly recommended. USB should be the second point of storage.

Conveyance Allowance Information

Families may be eligible to claim assistance with travel expenses if the student lives at least 4.8 km from the school and they are attending their closest school. Claim forms are available for free bus travel or for the private car allowance and may be obtained from the school.

D.E.A.R.

Drop Everything And Read. For the first twenty minutes after lunch students are required to take a novel into their class to read. This program has been running successfully in our school for a number of years now. It is one strategy being used to help improve literacy. Students should ensure they have a book or other reading material at school for this purpose.

Diaries or Study Planners

A school study planner/diary will be allocated to **all** students in Year 7, 8 and 9 to record work due and plan for class work. Inside, the diary has a wealth of information about the school including our policies and contact phone numbers. The study planner/diary is for school related information. We do not want to see graffiti and inappropriate writing or pictures throughout the pages. Parents and teachers should be able to pick up, read or write in any student's study planner at any time.

Discipline

It is an expectation that all students behave in a safe and friendly manner, showing respect for others and their property. All teachers work closely with their classes to ensure maximum learning time is achieved. Initially poor behaviour is dealt with within the classroom. We have a buddy system whereby a misbehaving student may be asked to sit in another class for a while. Constant misbehaviour both in the classroom and in the playground will be brought to the attention of the Year Level Co-ordinator. For regular misdemeanors the Year Level Co-ordinator will deal with the student and contact parents.

Drop Off & Pick Up

All students are to be dropped off and picked up at the front of the school. There is no entry to the school property for drop off or pick up unless a child is ill or injured. The staff car park is for staff only and the school bus shelter is for buses only and is not to be used by parents as a drop off/pick up point.

Form Teacher and Form Assembly

Each day you will have form assembly in the same room with your form teacher. It is important to develop a good relationship with your form teacher.

Hats

The School Council has endorsed the Sun Smart Policy with regard to hats. All students are encouraged to wear a broad brimmed hat when outside the school building. It is in the student's best interest to support the Sun Smart program they followed in primary school. No hats are to be worn inside.

Homework

Students in Year 7 are required to do about one hour of homework a night. Plan a time that suits you so that you can still complete your chores and sport and other commitments. Parents are encouraged to be involved with their child's studies. Write comments to the teacher in the student's diary if you have any queries. For Mathematics there is a weekly homework sheet which will be due in on the same day each week. For English there may be reading, research or writing tasks to complete at home. All core subjects have a major assignment or project once a term which will need some home time to complete.

Illness

If you are unwell, you should advise your class teacher and they will send you to the General Office. The office staff will make contact with home and send you to the sick bay until you can be collected. **Do not go directly to the sick bay or call home yourself.**

Instrumental Music

The Music staff and visiting instrumental specialists provide a comprehensive music program. If you are interested in learning an instrument contact the Music Co-ordinator for more information. Lesson fees/instrumental hire charges apply.

Late to school or Early to Leave

Go the front office if you are late to school. A pass will then be issued to you. Habitual lateness will incur a phone call home and an after-school detention.

If you need to leave early for any reason during the day then the Early Leavers Pass must be issued. If you have an appointment and know what time you will be leaving then you can collect an early leaver's pass before school. This is essential, especially if we have a fire/evacuation drill and need to check the whereabouts of all students. Passes are issued at the front office.

Lockers

Students are allocated a locker near their form room. **You will be provided with a lock at the beginning of the year and you will be expected to use it at all times.** Year Level Coordinators will have a master key in case of an emergency. Don't leave money or valuables in your bag. Lock it in your locker or ask the office staff to look after it for you until the end of the day. We try to minimise students' access time to their lockers to ensure theft does not happen but every now and again items are taken, usually from an unlocked locker or from a student's bag. An engraving service for calculators, memory sticks and other items is available.



Lunch Orders

These must be filled out **before school** at the canteen. Lunch orders can be collected from the lunch order line in the canteen at the start of lunchtime.

Medications

If students need to take any medication they need to bring it to the front office with a signed note stating frequency and amount to be taken. **Medications are not to be stored in school bags or lockers.** This includes paracetamol. If you would like your child to be able to take paracetamol in the event they require it when at school, please send a note and a named box of paracetamol for this purpose to the office to be stored in the medication cupboard.



Mobile Phones and Ipods

Personal mobile phones and ipods must not be used at school. If they need to be brought to school then they must be kept in a locked locker, not in school bags. They are not to be used between 8:30 and 3:30 and are not insured if damaged or lost. If a phone is confiscated by a staff member then the student may collect it at the end of the day. A second offence requires a parent to collect the phone or ipod and a third time means that the student is no longer able to bring the item to school.

Netbooks

Students will have access to netbooks via charging trolleys throughout the school. A *Buy Your Own Device* (BYOD) program is available – please see separate sheet.

Newsletters

Newsletters are compiled fortnightly on the even weeks of term. These are emailed to parents with an email address, otherwise they are delivered via the post.

Parent & Student Portal - XUNO

These give students access to worksheets from each of their classes, their timetable and other information about what is happening at school via the student bulletin. Work can be sent to teachers via the Student Portal. Students will be shown how they can access this from home. Parent user names/passwords will be mailed home to families.

Paying Money

Money for camps and excursions can be paid at the front office before school or at recess. Printing money can be paid at the canteen window before school. Parents can also make payments online to the school via BPay or telephone the school and provide credit card details.

Students' Representative Council (SRC)

Two students will be nominated from each class and are expected to attend meetings of the Students' Representative Council. Decisions are often made about school socials and fund raising activities.

Timetable

A personal timetable will be given to each student on the first day of each term. Students need to stick these in their study planners. If lost, they can be downloaded from our portal. Students will be shown how to do this. Refer to Page 16 for tips on reading your timetable.

Assemblies

Each week there will be either full school assemblies or year level assemblies. These are an important part of the school program where important information is relayed to students.

Uniform

Uniform at Red Cliffs Secondary College is compulsory from Years 7 to 12. Students who must come to school out of uniform are to present a note from home to the General Office before school and obtain a pass. Students arriving after Form Assembly must obtain a pass from the office at recess. Refer to Page 13 for a description of the uniform and details of our supplier.

Water bottles

Students are encouraged to drink water and water bottles are permitted in class (with some restrictions on where they can be stored in computer labs). Interruptions to class for drink and toilet breaks are disruptive and students should use recess and lunch breaks to ensure these needs are met.

Year Level Co-ordinator

Each level has a co-ordinator who keeps a record of each student's progress both academically and socially. The Year Level Co-ordinator is usually the first point of contact if communication is needed between home and school.

Camps, Sports & Excursions Fund (CSEF)

Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom. The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund will ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities.

School **camp**s provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors, **excursions** encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works and **sports** teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are part of a healthy curriculum.

CSEF will be provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. The allowance will be paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions, or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student will be:

- \$125 for primary school students
- \$225 for secondary school students

Students are encouraged to wear hats, although they are **not** to be worn in the buildings.





You will be assigned to the same House as older brothers or sisters who have attended this school. If you have no previous family connection, then you are randomly placed so that numbers are equal in each House. Once assigned to a House you remain in that House until you leave the College.

As a member of a House you have the opportunity to compete in swimming, cross country and athletics.

- The swimming carnival is held at the Red Cliffs Swimming Pool early in Term 1. Students participate in trials to determine who will represent their House.
- The cross country event is held in Term 2 and all students participate. Training takes place in PE classes and students are encouraged to continue this training at home.
- Term 3 is dedicated to athletics. Trials are held during PE classes and the carnival is held during week 6.

Performances at these carnivals enable teams to be selected for the Inter school carnivals held in Mildura.

The results of all three carnivals are added and at Speech Night at the end of the year, the champion House for the year is announced and the shield awarded to House captains. Sporting Blues certificates are awarded to students who have achieved excellence in their chosen sports. All students who represent the College are also awarded certificates with a record of their participation. Junior and senior boy and girl sports awards are presented to the most outstanding students of the year.

There are numerous opportunities for students to represent the College in a wide range of sports. Students are selected after attendance at trials/training and are required to be up to date with all class and home work in order to participate. College representation is considered an honour, and behaviour and sportsmanship must reflect the high standards expected of our students.

Students who win locally are offered the opportunity to attend Loddon Mallee Region and VSSSA (State) finals.
